24 COUNTRIES • 50,000 KM • 3 YEARS

PHASE 1: ACROSS CANADA

I started my Cross Canada journey on November 12, 2019 at the Atlantic Terry Fox Memorial in St. Johns NL and I completed it at the Pacific Terry Fox Memorial in Victoria BC. Originally, the plan was to head north west to Tuktoyaktuk NWT at the top of the Dempster Highway. Covid-19 put an end to those plans. I will revaluate the possibility of returning to ride the Dempster Highway when I get to the bottom of Argentina.



PHASE 2: USA, CENTRAL & SOUTH AMERICA

Phase 2 of this ride has me riding much of the Pacific coast of the US and zigzagging myself to the bottom of the world in Ushuaia, Argentina. My route brings me through all 24 countries in North, Central and South America (including the Island of Trinidad). This phase of the ride should be completed in about two years.

This epic adventure should last about three years and have me pedal at least 50,000 kilometres in total distance.






ONE MILLION TREES!


